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**MINUTES OF THE
REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
Thursday, October 29, 2020**

I. CALL TO ORDER

There being a quorum, the regular meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 3:00 p.m., Thursday, October 29, 2020. Present at the meeting were:

Present was Dorothy P. Harris and Port Staff.

Before proceeding onto the items on the agenda, the Chairman welcomed the newly appointed Board Member Dorothy P. Harris. Mr. Harris was appointed by the Governor on October 6, 2020 to fill the seat of former Board member Maria Taitano, whose term had expired. A virtual confirmation hearing was held on October 21, 2020. The status of Ms. Harris' confirmation is still before the Committee. If confirmed, Ms. Harris' will serve a three-year term on the Port Authority Board from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2023.

Addendum to Agenda

At this time, the Chairman mentioned that there is an item to be added onto the agenda under new business – IFB-020-002 Repainting of the PAG North CMU Wall Phase II Project and various Port Buildings, and asked whether there were any objections. Director Koki made motion to add IFB-020-002 item onto the agenda, seconded by the Vice Chairman. Motion was unanimously approved.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

a. **September 24, 2020 – Regular Board Meeting:** Director Koki made motion to approve the minutes of September 24, 2020, subject to correction. The motion was seconded by the Vice Chairman and was unanimously passed.

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS

IV. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The General Manager welcomed Ms. Harris and noted for the record that Ms. Harris' presence is simply to observe the proceedings in today's Board meeting and her attendance is not being used to count as quorum, nor will she participate in any voting of the items on the agenda.

Proceeding with the General Manager's Report, the following was reported.

1. **Approaches to Help Safeguard Against COVID-19.** The Port continues to provide a workplace environment that is in line with the Governor's emergency declaration and guidelines.

- **Port Clinic.** As of this morning, the Port Clinic visits totaled 31,345 with zero fevers or any COVID-19 symptoms recorded.
- **Port E-Advisories.**
 - Port E-Advisory No. 24 (October 9) – Guidelines to follow when experiencing symptoms at work, and processes on what to do when exposed to a confirmed positive for COVID-19.
- **Port's Contact Tracing Team.** The Port's total COVID-19 positive are 19 port employees. The Port Contact Tracing Team has been able to identify 396 cases of employee close contact exposure and has coordinated testing for all exposures with DPHSS. The status of the 19 port employees are as follows: 10 are back to work, 1 hospitalized, 4 under home quarantine, 1 under government quarantine and 3 are waiting clearance to report back to work from DPHSS.

2. **Celebrating Port Week – 45th Anniversary.** This week marks the Port's 45th anniversary. A series of virtual events took place due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The first event began on October 26 with a virtual opening ceremony, consisting of a flag-raising ceremony followed by a parade of trucks, proclamation signing by Governor Lou Leon Guerrero and Lt. Governor Joshua Tenorio, and resolution presentation by the Port's Oversight Chairman Senator Clynt Ridgell. At the end of the virtual opening ceremony, a video was debuted honoring our frontliners called "The Port in the Pandemic". Other virtual events include a Town Hall Celebration & Employee Awards Ceremony that was held on October 27; a presentation to the Port Users Group Guam on October 28; Port Modernization-We Keep Guam Moving premiered this morning at 11am and to be premiered on October 30 is 45 years of Port Strong.

3. **Demolition of Derelict Vessel at Seaplane Ramp.** On October 7, 2020 a derelict vessel "Azuma" that had been abandoned for nine years was finally demolished. This was made possible with the assistance of Department of Public Works. The Azuma was originally a liveaboard vessel docked at the Agat Marina which was abandoned by its original owners. After several storms that hit Guam, it began to take on water. To prevent the Azuma from completely sinking, it was drained from all remaining fuel, cleared of all toxins and tugged to Seaplane Ramp on September 2011.

4. **Certificate of Excellence in CCR.** On October 16, 2020 the Association of Government Accountants (AGA) awarded the Port Authority of Guam with a Certificate of Excellence in the Port's Citizen-Centric Reporting for Fiscal Year 2019. AGA offers these certificate of excellence awards for entities that prepare and distribute a high-quality CCR Report. In their review, the AGA determined that the presentation of the Port's CCR report overall was very informative with great content material, visual appeal, and readability. Further, AGA applauds the Port's commitment to good government and responsible fiscal action.

5. **In-House Port Attorney.** Still in active recruitment.

6. **General Manager's Notes for YTD Finances, as of September 30, 2020.**

REVENUES AND CARGO THROUGHPUT:

- The Port's Total Operating revenue for September 2020 is \$54.5 million, which is -3.8% or \$2.2M lower compared to YTD September FY20 budget projection of \$56.8M. The total number of containers handled as of September 2020 is 85,143, which is 0.2% higher or 189 more containers compared to last year's September 2019 total.

OPERATING EXPENSES:

- Overall spending YTD (Actual versus Budget for FY2020) is 8% less, or \$4.2M in YTD cost avoidances.

OVERTIME EXPENSE AND DIRECT LABOR REVENUE:

- Overtime YTD for Division involved in Operations is \$1,379,753, which is 14.7% higher than YTD overtime budget of \$1,202,750. The overtime for September resulted in an increase of 11% or \$9K as compared to August, from \$80,393 in August to \$89,276 in September.
- Direct Labor reimbursement is \$3.4M which is 1.2% or \$40K increase from the FY20 budget. (This means that although OT expense is 14.7% over budget YTD, this projected budget shortfall is covered by the direct labor reimbursement.) Here is the breakdown:

YTD OPERATING REVENUES MINUS YTD EXPENSES

- Total Net Income for Fiscal Year 2020 is \$4.4M. The YTD Income is 26% higher than net income FY2019. The total net income in FY20 is lower by 33% or \$2.2M as compared to FY20 Projection primarily due to the months from April to June that resulted into lower cargos and decrease in other related cargo revenues.

7. **Guam Shipyard-Hotel Wharf.** On July 10, 2020, Guam Shipyard (GSY) requested permission from the Port to conduct specific lifting and vessel deconstruction activities at Hotel Wharf on the following:

- YON-286 Barge – GSY has yet to submit a disposal plan and specific timelines for the dismantling of YON-286 barge. Follow up with GSY continues.

8. **MARAD's America's Marine Highway Program.** The Port had an opportunity to communicate with MARAD on moving forward with the designation application process. This initiative will be in conjunction with the CNMI's Commonwealth Ports Authority. The program's focus is to expand the use of America's navigable waters to reduce landside congestion through the designation of marine highway routes. If successful, this program designation is an opportunity for our seaports to apply for MARAD grant funding that is limited to the Secretary-designated highways. Eligible projects include, but not limited to container yard handling equipment, landside projects, RORO projects, planning grants and other project enhancements to existing transportation services.

9. **Grant Opportunities**

a. **EDA Grant Application.** The PAG/EDA collaboration has resulted in the finalization of the \$3.016 Million grant amount. The Port is waiting for SHPO's feedback on Section 106 consultation concurrence letter. Upon receipt, the PAG will submit to EDA.

b. **Department of Agriculture Grant. *No new development.*** The Port is waiting AG's Office release of the MOU. Background: The Port signed an MOU on July 23, 2020.-The MOU is subject to review and approval by BBMR, AG's Office, and Governor Lou Leon Guerrero. This grant for \$500K is to support the repair work of Agat Marina Dock B.

c. **Gantry Crane Acquisition.**

i. **USDA Direct Loan.** The final draft application for the direct loan was completed on October 23, 2020. Meeting with USDA delayed due to COVID-19; conference call is being scheduled.

ii. **EDA Grant.** Final Draft of the EDA grant application for two (2) STS gantry cranes is completed. Currently transcribing Narratives into EDA templates. Estimated cost for two cranes is \$30M with the Port share at \$15 Million.

d. **FEMA – COVID-19 Public Assistance.**

1. Project Worksheet (PW) #1 - Safety and Sanitation of PAG Public Facilities. FEMA has approved PAG reimbursement of \$21,920.29 for the cost associated with PPEs, supplies, and materials. However, since \$7,266.30 has been paid by the CARES Act funding, the PAG revised its reimbursement request to reflect the reduction to \$14,653.99.

2. Project Worksheet (PW) #2 - Based on a conference call with FEMA, the PAG's reimbursement request will not be approved. However, no formal letter has been received by the PAG. Upon receipt of a decline letter, the PAG will appeal. Background: Overtime Labor for Continuity of Port Operations. PAG is seeking reimbursement for labor costs in the amount of \$7.3M in federal funds. Currently under review by FEMA.

3. Project Worksheet (PW) #3 – Additional Safety and Sanitation of PAG Facilities request for reimbursement being compiled by Finance and Strategic Planning.

e. MARAD Port Infrastructure Development Program Grant Application.

The PAG was not awarded the equipment grant. All MARAD awarded projects for FY2020 were capital improvement projects (CIP). Background: The Port submitted a Comprehensive Acquisition of Container Yard Equipment application to MARAD for review to the tune of \$7.4M, which includes:

- 2 ea. 80,000 Lbs. Top Lifters
- 5 ea. 12,000 Lbs. Forklifts
- 1 ea. 275 Ton Telescopic Crane
- 10 ea. Tractor Trailers
- 2 ea. 40-Plug Mobile Reefer Generators
- 1 ea. 150 Ft. Telescopic Man Lift

10. **Port Revenue Bonds Project Status.** As of October 28, 2020, the attachment provides information on the status of the revenue bond projects that consist of rehabilitation of hotel wharf, golf pier repairs and improvements, waterline replacement/relocation, EQMR building, and warehouse 1 repair/upgrades, new admin annex building, and other priority projects.

V. OLD BUSINESS

There were no old business discussed.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

1. **Board Resolution No. 2020-07 thru 2020-15 – Port Retirees:** Director Koki made motion to approve Board Resolution No. 2020-07 thru 2020-15 relative to commending and congratulating all port retirees (as presented) from the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port. Motion was seconded by the Vice Chairman and was unanimously approved.

2. **Determination of Need for an Exceptional Term – Area A Tank Farm:** The General Manager mentioned that Public Law 32-40, passed on June 11, 2013, added a new Section 5351 to Article 6 of Chapter 5 – Guam Procurement Act, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to the duration of commercial leases for public real property and related facilities. The law included a requirement which the Board of Directors would need to comply with prior to issuing a solicitation if the Port intends to lease its properties/facilities beyond the 5-year standard term, which states in part: Exceptional Term Contract - “prior to any solicitation,

the Board must approve a written Determination of Need justifying by a quantifiable sum an Exceptional Term Contract, and specifying the full term, inclusive of extensions, options and renewals of such contract. It requires the solicitation to be published in a newspaper of general circulation and the written Determination of Need shall be valid for 2 years or until an exceptional term contract has been executed to fill the stated need, whichever comes first.”

By way of background, Mobil Petroleum Corporation was using Area A Tank Farm to store fuel; however, the tanks have not been in use since 2010. The decision to stop using the tanks was based on a federal consent decree, which mandated Mobil to either bring the facility into compliance with federal regulations or discontinue its use. The costs associated in rehabilitating the fuel tanks was estimated to be over \$10 million at that time. Since then, Area A has been idle. Based on the 2013 Port Master Plan Update, Port Consultants estimated the liquid bulk cargo should increase from 6.96 million barrels in 2013 to 8.42 million barrels in 2033.

Area A Tank Farm is located on the north side of Cabras Highway, between Golf Pier and the Port Administration Building on Cabras Island. The land size is approximately 16,000+ square meters. There are five (5) fuel storage tanks and are summarized as follows:

The facility has a paved yard, pipelines, security fence, fire suppression and fuel spill containment systems. Three (3) fuel tanks and a loading rack are not in use due to deteriorating resulting from lack of maintenance and capital improvements. Power and water are on site but no sewer. The topography of the site is fairly level. The 2013 Master Plan Update has identified the current use and track designation as a fueling facilities and cement loading area. The area has been determined to be outside the 0.2 annual change of flood plain zone. The improvements to the facility is estimated at \$22 million if the lessor is to rehabilitate the tanks and loading rack.

Because of the amount of investment expected for the lessor to rehabilitate the current facility, it is requested that this lease be an Exceptional Term Contract based on the following reasons:

1. The greater financial benefit from renovation or redevelopment that contemplates major capital improvements to the property would allow for business expansion, modernization of facilities, aesthetic enhancement; or that will sustain or increase the existing revenue stream to the Port Authority of Guam by such expansion or renovation of the existing facility;

2. The length of a new or exceptional term contract term should be based on the reasonable life expectancy of such improvement. Any exceptional term contract will be based on the magnitude of capital improvement to be made by the Lessor and the economic life expectancy of the development; and
3. The Port wishes to consider other relevant information in determining if a longer lease term is warranted, such as, if the investment is expected to generate above average returns to the Port and/or will reposition the property to a higher standard of quality and use.

As such, being presented before the Board is a resolution for approval relating to the Determination of Need for an Exceptional Term Contract for Area A Tank Farm and to authorize management to proceed with a Request for Information (RFI) to generate interest to lease Area A and use the area to rehabilitate the existing fuel storage tanks or build new storage tanks.

a. **Board Resolution No. 2020-16** – Director Koki made motion to adopt Board Resolution No. 2020-16 relative to approving the determination of need for an exceptional term contract for Area A Tank Farm, seconded by the Vice Chairman. Motion was unanimously approved.

3. **IFB-020-002 - Repainting of the PAG North CMU Wall Phase II Project and various Port Buildings:** The General Manager presented the executive summary which states that fifteen (15) firms officially picked up IFB packets, while only six (6) participated in the bid opening held on July 1, 2020. During the bid opening process, a review of all bids were made and it was determined that the responsible and responsive bidder with the lowest price was ProPacific Builders Corporation in the amount of \$195,844.55. As a result, management requests the Board to approve the award to ProPacific Builders that has been deemed to have met all the requirements set forth in the Information for Bid and is consistent with the Guam Procurement Regulations.

Director Koki made motion to approve the contract award to ProPacific Builders Corporation for IFB-020-002 Repainting of the PAG North CMU Wall Phase II Project and various Port Building project, seconded by the Vice Chairman. Motion was unanimously approved.

On other related procurement matters, the General Manager reported that by way of an MOA with the Office of the Attorney General, Attorney Tom Keeler, Assistant Attorney General has been assigned to the Port Authority temporarily to provide legal assistance. Given the short period, the Port had identified five (5) major procurement projects for Atty. Keeler to work on. The following includes: 1) Legal Services contract (As there was a protest on this bid proposal, it was recommended by the Attorney General's Office to start this bid process again.); 2) Golf Pier project; 3) Crane Demolition/Dismantling project; 4) Performance Management Contract; and 5) Information Technology Consulting Firm.


VII. ADJOURNMENT

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General Manager's Report for Board of Directors

November 24, 2020

1. **Approaches to Help Safeguard Against COVID-19.** We continue to provide for a workplace environment that is in line with the Governor's emergency declaration and guidelines.
 - **Port Clinic.** As of this morning, the Port Clinic visits totaled 35,028.
 - **Port's Contact Tracing Team.** The Port's total COVID-19 positive are 20 port employees. The Port Contact Tracing Team has been able to identify 409 cases of employee close contact exposure and has coordinated testing for all exposures with DPHSS.

The status of the 20 port employees are as follows: 17 are back to work, 1 under home quarantine, 1 under GovGuam quarantine and we are mourning the loss of our fellow co-worker, a frontline hero and covid warrior +Henry San Nicolas.

2. **Memorial Ceremony & Salute of Trucks - +Henry I. San Nicolas.** A memorial ceremony will be held for Port Employee +Henry San Nicolas on November 25th, with arrival time at 7:30am and start time at 7:45am. Henry is the Port's first Frontline Hero and COVID Warrior to pass away due to COVID-19.

3. **In-House Counsel** – Still in active recruitment.

In the interim and by way of an MOA with the OAG, Assistant Attorney General Tom Keeler has been temporarily assigned to the Port to assist in our procurement projects. We have provided Attorney Keeler with a list of priority projects:

- Legal Services;
- Golf Pier Repair;
- ITCF – Information Technology Consulting Firm;
- Deconstruction of Port Assets; and
- CCTV & Access Control.

Atty. Keeler started the week of October 19th.

4. **Delegation of Procurement Authority.** The Chief Procurement Officer (CPO) granted the Port Authority with its delegation of procurement authority for the current fiscal year, so this delegation of procurement authority will expire on September 30, 2021, and hopefully renewed if the CPO sees fit to it.

5. **OPA Entrance Conference FY2020.** We held an entrance conference with the Office of Public Accountability (OPA) on November 18, 2020. We presented three top management concerns that includes: 1) COVID-19 (revenue, expenses, and the application of federal and local statutes as it relates to COVID-19, specifically the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA or Act)). This Act requires certain employers to provide employees with paid sick leave or expanded family and medical leave for specified reasons related to COVID-19. Department of Labor is to provide guidance on the enforcement of this new law's paid leave requirements; 2) Procurement Matters; and 3) Legal Counsel and Port Staff Attorney.

We also highlighted key financial milestones for the Port's Financial Performance:

- Net Income for FY 20 is \$4,166,636, 18% higher than FY19 Net Income of \$3,527,636
- Total Operating Revenues as of September 2020 was \$54.6M, 0.8% or \$447K lower than last year YTD September (\$46.7M).
- Total number of containers handled as of September 2020 was 85,143, which is 0.2% higher or 189 containers more as compared to last year September 2019 YTD total.
- Total Operating Expenses as of September 2020 was \$47.5M, which is 8% or \$4.1M lower than Budget (\$51.5M) and 1.4% or \$657K lower than last year's total operating expenses (\$48.1M).
- Year to date Operating Revenues minus the Year to date Operating Expenses resulted in an Operating Income of \$7.2M as of September 30, 2020.

Next conference date with OPA is scheduled for December 18.

6. **General Manager's Notes for YTD Finances, as of October 31, 2020.** We are providing the following summary:

REVENUES AND CARGO THROUGHPUT:

- The Port's Total Operating revenue for October 2020 is \$4.5 million, which is -2.4% or \$111K lower compared to YTD October FY21 budget projection of \$4.6M.
- The total number of containers handled as of October 2020 is 7,068 which is 7.4% lower or 568 less containers compared to last year's October 2019 total.

OPERATING EXPENSES:

- Overall spending YTD (Actual versus Budget for FY2020) of \$3.7M is 17% lower than the budget for October of \$4.4M, or \$740K in YTD cost avoidances.

OVERTIME EXPENSE AND DIRECT LABOR REVENUE:

- Overtime YTD for Divisions involved in Operations is \$96,630, which is 10% lower than YTD overtime budget of \$107,341. The overtime for October resulted in an increase of 8% or \$7K as compared to September, from \$89,276 in September to \$96,630 in October.
- Direct Labor reimbursement is \$258K which is 5% or \$14K decrease from the FY21 budget. Here is the breakdown:

- The net income for the month of October is \$642K.

7. **Guam Shipyard-Hotel Wharf.** On July 10, 2020, Guam Shipyard (GSY) requested permission from the Port to conduct specific lifting and vessel deconstruction activities at Hotel Wharf on the following:
 - YON-286 Barge – GSY has yet to submit a disposal plan and specific timelines for the dismantling of YON-286 barge. Follow up with GSY continues.
8. **Grant Opportunities**
 - a. **EDA Grant Application.** Communication between Planning and the SHPO ongoing. The SHPO requested, as part of its final review, the Area of Potential Effect (APE) for the project. The response was submitted to Mr. John Mark Joseph on November 20, 2020. Mr. Joseph anticipates issuing the SHPO's concurrence shortly thereafter, unless further concerns are brought up. The grant amount for this application is \$3.016 Million.
 - b. **Department of Agriculture Grant. *No new development.*** The Port is waiting for the AG's Office release of the MOU. Background: The Port signed an MOU on July 23, 2020.-The MOU is subject to review and approval by BBMR, AG's Office, and Governor Lou Leon Guerrero. This grant for \$500K is to support the repair work of Agat Marina Dock B.
 - c. **Gantry Crane Acquisition**
 1. **USDA Direct Loan.** The final draft application for the direct loan was completed on October 23, 2020. Meeting with USDA delayed due to COVID-19; a conference call is being scheduled.
 2. **EDA Grant.** Draft narratives have been transcribed into EDA templates and the SF425 (application) is complete. The estimated cost for two (2) cranes is \$30M with the PAG's share at \$15M. Currently waiting on the project breakdown of the cost estimate from Port Consultant WSP.

d. **FEMA – COVID-19 Public Assistance.**

1. Project Worksheet (PW) #1 – *Pending FEMA review and decision on PAG submission.* Safety and Sanitation of PAG Public Facilities. FEMA has approved PAG reimbursement of \$21,920.29 for the cost associated with PPEs, supplies, and materials. However, since \$7,266.30 has been paid by the CARES Act funding, the PAG revised its reimbursement request to reflect the reduction to \$14,653.99.
2. Project Worksheet (PW) #2 – *Pending formal response by FEMA.* Based on a conference call with FEMA, the PAG's reimbursement request will not be approved. However, the Port has yet to receive a formal decline letter. Upon receipt of a decline letter, the PAG will appeal. Background: Overtime Labor for Continuity of Port Operations. PAG is seeking reimbursement for labor costs for \$7.3M in federal funds.
3. Project Worksheet (PW) #3 – Amounts have been finalized by Finance; Planning will review and submit online via FEMA's Grant Portal. This project worksheet is for additional safety and sanitation of PAG facilities' request for reimbursement.

- e. **MARAD America's Marine Highway (AMH) Program.** We have tentatively scheduled a meeting for next week between MARAD's Program Managers, the CNMI, and the Port to further discuss this important opportunity.

As background, the Port recently met with MARAD (via Zoom meeting) regarding the AMH Program. The AMH is a MARAD initiative that designated 25 marine highways in the US and its territories (American Samoa and Puerto Rico). A designation opens up MARAD funding to assist with landside projects to include the acquisition of container yard equipment for the Port and the CNMI Commonwealth Ports Authority (CPA) to jointly apply for the designation.

9. **2020 Master Plan Update.** The Port's Management Team continue to meet with WSP on a weekly basis (every Wednesday) resulting in significant progress in the following areas:

- **Stakeholders Meetings** – WSP and the Port has been successful in data gathering through interviews with the Port's partners – military, federal, and private sector.
- **PAG/PUGG/Customs/WSP collaboration on systems integration** – an initiative to define the need for improved data and information sharing/reporting between all stakeholders involved in the cargo supply chain at the Port.
- **IT Upgrade discussions** – WSP support to Port IT and TOS to promote efficient interface and operations.
- **Guam Customs Inspection Facility Feasibility Study** – ongoing PAG/WSP/customs collaboration on the Port's assistance to Customs on the usage and facility design options on a 4-acre parcel of land adjacent to the main terminal gate. To date, four (4) options have been presented with two potential scenarios being further tabled.
- **Tariff Simplification** – the Port's Tariff Simplification Team (Finance, Operations, IT) continues to meet with WSP weekly. We prepared a "Guiding Principles" document to establish objectives of the meeting and how the Team will accomplish the simplification of Port tariffs. The Guiding Principles provide the following objectives:
 - **Revenue neutral** – Ensure the revisions will result in neither a material increase nor decrease in Port revenues
 - **User-friendly** – Present schedule of rates table in front of tariff to allow customers to quickly and easily calculate fees
 - **Transparent** – Itemize details, rules and regulations associated with combined rates via hyperlink in latter sections of tariff
 - **Streamlined** – Consolidate charges to align with all-inclusive port services and performance reports
 - **Modernized** – Support the integration of the Port's NAVIS Terminal Operating System and JDE Financial System
 - **Time-saving** – Minimize/eliminate manual data entry of charges and provide invoices to users expeditiously
 - **Cost-effective** – Reduce administrative costs, manual entry errors, disputes, and delayed payments

- **Update CIP and Port Wharves Project** – the Port and WSP has been aggressively assessing critically important CIP projects and working towards completing F1 – F6 comprehensive assessments towards Scopes of Work development.
- **Area A Feasibility Study** – continued collaboration between the Port and WSP is ongoing weekly on best uses and development of potential alternative uses for the former Mobil site housing a building structure and several empty fuel tanks. A Solicitation of Interest (SOI) on Area A has been published on the Port's website and a newspaper of general circulation.
- **Solar Power Feasibility Study** – the Port and WSP continues to engage in the feasibility of installing a solar panel system on several Port building rooftops to reduce the Port's power consumption outlay.

10. **Port Revenue Bonds Project Status.** As of November 20, 2020, the attachment provides information on the status of the revenue bond projects that consist of rehabilitation of hotel wharf, golf pier repairs and improvements, waterline replacement/relocation, EQMR building, and warehouse 1 repair/upgrades, new admin annex building, and other priority projects.

WHEREAS, Mr. Henry I. San Nicolas will always be remembered for his smile, kindness, and dedication to his family, friends and his Port Strong Family; and


WHEREAS, Mr. Henry I. San Nicolas' true legacy lies in the profound effect he had on those who loved him; now, therefore, be it

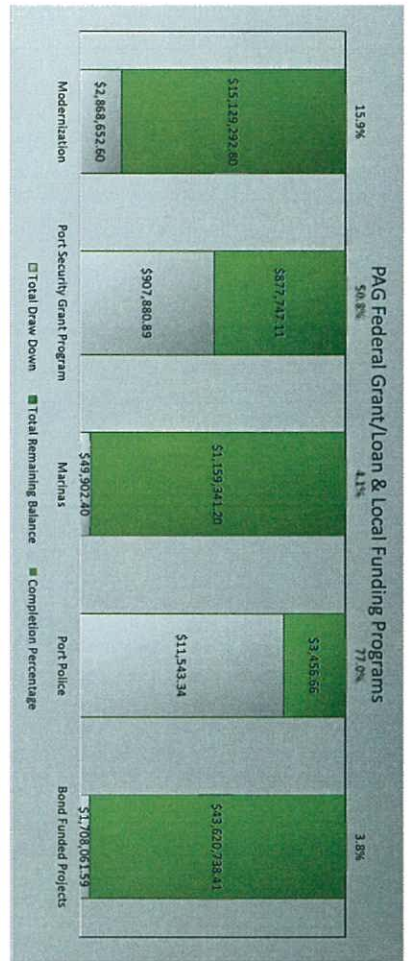
